Arthur Brooks Gleichert born April 27, 1939 in Yonkers, New York to Arthur and Marjorie Gleichert, passed away Wednesday, August 29, 2018 at Glacier Hills Senior Living Community in Ann Arbor, Michigan.

Brooks graduated from Roosevelt high school, Yonkers, NY in 1957, and went onto obtaining his Bachelors of Science degree from Marietta College, Marietta, Ohio in 1961. Brooks married the love of his life Linda Lucas on November 15, 1958 and together had three children. After college he moved his family to Michigan, worked as a sales manager for American Cyanamid Plastics, until he founded the beginnings of NoIR in 1972. NoIR started with just Brooks and two partners, grew into having forty plus employees, and is still a family run company to this day. Brooks and his wife Linda were avid golfers, he also enjoyed snow skiing at the family cabin in Utah, and was a part of the Rotary Club in Ann Arbor, MI.

He is survived by his wife Linda (Lucas) Gleichert; their children, Anna (Michael) Smiglewski, Amy (David) Gleichert-Bothner, and Marc (Kimberly) Gleichert, ten grandchildren, four great grandchildren with two on the way, and Linda's daughter Pam Ziegler and Pam's two children.
