



Robert Lee McNaughton

September 13, 1935 - January 26, 2019

On Saturday, January 26, 2019, Robert Lee “Bob” McNaughton, loving and beloved husband, father, grandfather, and great-grandfather passed away at the age of 83.

Bob was born on September 13, 1935 in Detroit, Michigan. He lived with his family in Bay City before moving to Ann Arbor where he attended the University of Michigan. Bob also served in the U.S. Army Reserves.

Bob spent his professional career in the printing industry. He was Vice President and co-founder of Lithocrafters from 1965 to 1975, prior to founding McNaughton & Gunn, Inc. in 1976, where he served as President until his retirement. Bob was very committed to his team at M&G and took great pride in their ongoing success.

In addition, Bob was active in various professional and business organizations, frequently serving in leadership roles. He received numerous awards and recognition throughout his career, including the Lewis Memorial Lifetime Achievement Award (an award presented to an individual who demonstrated long-term and outstanding contributions to the graphic arts industry). Bob was committed to M&G being an active corporate citizen and enriching local communities. He supported a variety of community groups and activities including the Foundation for Saline Area Schools, Washtenaw Literacy, the Ann Arbor Graphic Arts Memorial Foundation, Saline Safety Town, and youth sports teams.

Bob was a persistent tinkerer who always loved working on a good project. Lake Columbia was his second home where he could boat, fish, relax, and serve as the grillmaster for family gatherings. Bob loved the holidays — Christmas, Halloween, Easter, 4th of July, birthday parties — any opportunity to gather with family, share a meal, and have some fun. He enjoyed birding and golf and was a dedicated University of Michigan fan. He and

his loving wife Sally enjoyed traveling in the States and abroad, and spent numerous winters exploring the glories of the southwest.

Bob was preceded in death by his mother, Georgia, his father, Harold, his first wife, Orpha, and his big sister, Jeanne. He is survived by his wife Sally, his six children, Terri (Tom) Newland, Julie (Dennis) McFarland, Lori (Chris) Wood, Sandy (Greg) Peterson, Shirley (Bill) Wrobleski, and Paul (Betsy) Nagle-McNaughton, his brother Jim, an even dozen grandchildren, and a growing number of great-grandchildren.

The family would like to thank the staff at the Chelsea Retirement Community for their loving care and Arbor Hospice for their compassionate support.

A memorial service will be held on Friday, February 1, 2019 at Nie Family Funeral Homes, 3767 W. Liberty Road, Ann Arbor. There will be an informal visitation from 1 to 3 pm, with the formal service starting at 3 pm.
